## NL Employers' Council announces short listed organizations for seventh annual "Employer of Distinction" Awards

This year's awards luncheon will highlight how the winning employers have excelled in these areas in 2009, offering other employers the opportunity to learn from their successes. This year's judging panel is comprised of Dr. Wilfred Zerbe, Dean of the Faculty of Business Administration (Memorial University of Newfoundland), Heather Modlin, Director of Key Assets Newfoundland & Labrador, and Vince Withers, retired businessman and founding chairperson of the NL Employers' Council.
